1.1 Principles of a CO₂ Laser

LASER is the acronym for Light Amplification by Stimulated Emission of Radiation. A CO₂ laser works by electrically stimulating the molecules within a carbon dioxide gas mixture. When focused through a lens, this highly-intense and invisible beam will vaporize many materials. Depending on the speed and intensity of the projected beam, a CO₂ laser may be used to engrave or cut through a wide variety of materials.

1.2 Safety Ratings

The LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS is equipped with a sealed carbon-dioxide laser that emits intense and invisible laser radiation with a wavelength of 10.6 microns in the infrared spectrum. The laser system is designated as a Class 4 laser device, meaning that the system is equipped with key safety features and an enclosed laser head to completely contain the laser under normal use. One of the key safety features found on the

LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS is a Class 4 red beam safety guidance pointer (similar to a laser-pointer presentation pen) allowing the operator to see the exact location where the laser beam will fire.

1.3 The safety interlock System

The laser system is equipped with a safety interlock system utilizing magnetic sensors on the front access doors, laser-activation and door LED lights on the control panel. The magnetic sensors will deactivate the laser when the door is open. At this time, the "door" LED light found on the control panel will illuminate, indicating an open or improperly closed door. When the laser is in operation, the "laser" LED will illuminate to inform the operator that the laser is activated. If at any time, any of the access doors are open and the "laser" LED is illuminated, IMMEDIATELY unplug the laser system and contact GCC service team for technical support and maintenance instructions.

- DO NOT operate the laser system if any component of the safety system is malfunctioning.
- DO NOT attempt to remove or modify any component of the safety interlock system.



1.4 The safety Labels

According to CDRH standards, all fixed or removable covers that allow access to a laser beam must have the appropriate laser warning labels attached to them. These warning labels must be clearly visible to the operator prior to removing the cover. Additional labels must be applied inside of the machine and be visible in the event the covers are removed. A label clearly displaying the manufacturer's name, date of manufacture, description of product, model number, serial number, and compliance statement must be attached to the outside of the machine.

In compliance with CDRH standards, the required warning labels are affixed at the time of manufacture to the GCC LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS Series in the appropriate locations. These labels are not to be modified in any way or removed for any reason. Please familiarize yourself with the specific labels and their locations on the machine. Below is a list of all the safety labels and their locations on the machine.

Product Label

This label is located at the left side of the machine. All the product information such as Serial Number, Model Numbers, Laser Power and Electric power can be found here. Before requiring any tech support, always provide service person the information on this label.

CDRH Label

This label indicates the class level of CDRH.





CE Label

This label indicates the class level of CE.



Warning Label

Warning Label shows all the necessary information to be aware of during operation.



Laser Path Warning Label

The machines are very safe under normal functioning conditions. However, in case of any accident, Laser Path Warning Label will be affixed on the possible laser path. When operators are nearby these paths, they should be careful of the possible injury while the machine is operating.



Emergency Stop Label

This label indicates the emergency stop button. You can find this label on the right upper side of the machine.



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Aperture warning stickers (mirror):

This label indicates the laser path. Normally you can find this label inside of machine or laser exit. Please take extra caution of this area when you conduct maintenance or operate machine.

This label indicates the protection wavelength. You can find this label in the lower right corner of window.

Avoid hands being engaged in rotating gears

1.5 Safety Measures

1.5.1 General Safety

- LASER RADIATION WARNING: Exposure to laser radiation may result in burns to the skin and can cause severe eye damage. Proper use and regular maintenance of this machine is important to the safety of all people in the immediate area.
- Prior to operation, carefully read and familiarize yourself with the warning labels located on both your laser system and in this manual.
- Never leave the machine unattended during the laser cutting, engraving, and marking process. A remote connection to the laser system across a network does not void the requirement for constant supervision over the laser firing process.
- The laser may ignite combustible materials. A well-maintained fire extinguisher and operational smoke or fire detector should be kept in the vicinity of the machine.
- Caution—Use of controls or adjustments or performance of procedures other than those specified herein may result in hazardous radiation exposure.



Resulting debris from laser cutting are very dangerous and may cause fire hazard.
 DO NOT leave debris and scraps inside laser machine after job finished. Always keep machine clean after job finished.

NOTE

Each Laser machine is shipped with a single pair of safety goggles. If additional safety goggles are required, please contact GCC directly or an authorized GCC distributor. If you wish to purchase one on your own, please make sure the safety goggles meet these requirements: 9,300-10,600nm OD5+ Visible Light Transmission: 92.9%

- Always wear safety goggles when the laser system is in operation. Reflective materials may partially-reflect some of the invisible laser radiation. Severe eye damage may occur if proper safety goggles are not worn.
- Connect the machine to a properly grounded power outlet. Ensure the voltage of the power source is identical to the voltage of the machine.
- Do not open the laser access panel when the machine is plugged in.
- Do not attempt to modify or disassemble the laser module.
- Do not attempt to remove or modify any component of the machine's laser interlock safety system.
- Ensure the immediate work area of the machine is well-ventilated. Odors, vapors, and dust are by products generated during the laser engraving and cutting process. An exhaust system and vacuum cutting box are recommended. Please contact GCC or your local GCC distributor for more information.



- Do not work with heat-sensitive surfaces or materials that may generate toxic fumes, such as PVC and Teflon.
- Regularly clean and maintain your machine according to our cleaning and maintenance instructions in Chapter 6. Doing so will ensure your machine will operate effectively and safely over a long period of time.

1.5.2 Safety Notice for Class 4 Machine

When operating the laser system rating at Class 4, operators must wear goggles and follow the safety instructions to operate the machine.

Exposure to a Class 4 laser beam via direct radiation and indirect stray radiation may cause damage to both skin and eyes. Exposure to the Class 4 laser beam may cause ignition of combustible materials which can lead to a fire. A proper and well-maintained fire extinguisher should keep on hand next to the laser machine all the times.

A Class 4 laser system should be operated by trained individuals in areas dedicated to their use. Failsafe interlocks should be used to prevent unexpected entry into the controlled area, and access should be limited by the laser operator to persons who have been instructed as to the safety procedures and who are wearing proper laser protection eyewear when the laser is capable of emission.

The machine operator is responsible for providing information and safety protection to untrained personnel who may enter the laser controlled areas as visitors and should take all necessary protective measures to prevent he possible ignition or explosion of materials by the laser beam. A Class 4 laser system should be operated according to the following precautionary measures among others:

- The operator is obliged to appoint **a trained Laser Protection Officer** responsible for compliance with the relevant regulations.
- Identify the danger zone by installing warning lights and warning signs outside the area.
- The danger zone must be secured against unauthorized access.

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- The operator of a Class 4 laser system should always wear laser protection goggles suitable for the laser wavelength in use and with optical density at least OD5+ within the danger zone.
- An additional warning light should also be installed in a visible location to warn the machine operator of any emerging laser radiation.

1.6 Operating Environment

Please follow the guidelines when considering a suitable location to set the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS Series. Improper work environment may lead to operational malfunction and/or unsafe working conditions. The LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS Series should be placed and operated in a standard office-type environment.

- Avoid environments where the machine is exposed to high levels of dust, temperature (temperature exceeding 30°C or 85°F) or humidity (humidity exceeding 70% or where the ambient temperature is near the dew point).
- Avoid small, enclosed areas with poor ventilation.
- Avoid areas with high levels of noise and electrical noise.
- Designed to allow for rapid emergency egress
- Select a location that is large enough to accommodate the machine, an exhaust system, a computer and a work or storage table.
- Select a location in which the ambient temperature remains between 15°C and 30°C (60°F to 85°F).
- Select a location in which the relative humidity remains between 30% 40%.
- Select a location in which there is a short, direct path to the fume exhaust system.
- Set the machine on a floor surface that is completely even.
- Make sure your smoke or fire detection system in the immediate area is functioning.
- Setup the machine to be apart from the wall for at least 60 cm (2 feet)

2.1 Unloading and Unpacking

The LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS Series is shipped in one crate that contains the machine, the software, and all of the necessary accessories. The following section shows detailed step-by-step instructions for unpacking and assembly of the machine.

More than one person may be needed when loading and unloading the shipping crate in order to avoid body injury or damage to the machine.


NOTE

Please store the original shipping crate as it may be needed for transportation in the future.

Move the shipping crate close to the desired working location of the machine. Unpack using the following steps.

NOTE: It requires minimum 2 people to move the machine and make sure there is at least 3 meters space to allow the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS to be moved from the packing box to the working area. Make sure to move the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS to the working area from the front side of the machine. The Front mark on the crate indicates the front side of the machine.


Step 1: Remove the 6 metal clips that secure the top panel to the crate by using a flathead screwdriver.



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


Step 2: Lift the top panel and remove it.



Step 3: Use a flathead screwdriver to remove the brackets on the four corners of the crate.









Step 5: Pull the front panel and lower it to an angle of about 45 degrees and then pull it away from the crate. Do the same for the rear panel.

Remove the left and right panels in the same way after the front and rear panels have been removed.




Step 6: Unbuckle and remove the belts that holds the machine in place.



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


Step 7: Use a Phillips screwdriver to remove the brackets that holds the machine in place.




Step 8: Place the ramps as shown below and adjust the leg-glide to the uppermost position with a spanner. The machine can now be pushed off the base board via the ramps (The ramps are in a box within the crate).

NOTE: It requires minimum 2 people to move the machine.





Step 9: Fix the brake of caster (4 places) and LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS is ready to use.









4.1 Machine Setup (for LABEL EXPRESS & DECAL EXPRESS)

4.1.1 Roll Media Installation

Installation of airshaft and waste removal module

Step 1 Insert the airshaft into the media core and expand it to firmly grab the media.



Step 2 Secure the airshaft with media on the front side of the machine.








Step 3 Do the same to assemble another airshaft and install it to the machine on the rear side.



Step 4 Put the media core to waste removal module and use the knob to secure the media core in place.





Installation of roll media


Step 1 Pull up the lever to release the front pinch rollers.



Step 2 Pull up the lever on the back side of machine to release pinch rollers on the work area.




Step 3 Pull the media pass through the front pinch rollers.






Step 4 Pull the media beneath the front media shaft.



Step 5 Load the media to pass through the work area.









The waste separation shaft.






Tips: Stick the waste paper core with paper to remove the waste easily.


Step 16 After alignment, adhere the backing paper to the paper core.




Note: Make sure the backing paper is pulled taut in order to keep the paper tension before adhering to paper core.

Step 18 Put down the lever to lower the front pinch rollers and the pinch rollers on the platen.






Step 19 Attach the front media clamps (left and right) on the platen and slide the clamps to align with the edge of the media.



Make sure the protrusion on the media clamp is wedged in the groove on the platen.



Step 20 Turn on the roll system of LabelExpress and put down the lever to lower the front pinch rollers.






Step 21 Select "Auto feed" on the control panel to feed the media and then attach the rear media clamps (left and right) to align with the edge of the media.



Step 22 Place the gravity bar onto the media to keep the paper tension while moving the media.




Step 23 Installation is complete.





4.1.2 Media Support Bracket of the Waste Drawer (DECAL EXPRESS only)

The Waste drawer is a recessed container attached onto the work platform, which is used to collect unnecessary materials when performing cut through function. Media Support Brackets hold the media and keep the media flat while moving back and forth.

The media support brackets are pre-installed in the waste drawer as shown below.






Make sure media support brackets are secured in proper position and the DECAL EXPRESS is ready to work.

The media support bracket is fixed by the magnet underneath; users can move the bracket to suitable position whenever needed.





4.1.3 Powering Up the Machine

Make sure both the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS and the computer are turned off before connecting either to a power source.

- 1) Connect the male end of the power cord to a quality surge protector and then connect the surge protector to a properly grounded outlet.
- 2) Do the same for the computer system.
- Connect the female end of the power cord to the machine's power cable inlet located on the rear side of machine.

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5) Tight up the knob from the roll which is on the machine.



6) The installation of roll media is completed.




5.1 Using the Hardware

5.1.1 Control Panel Overview

The Control Panel

The control panel on the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS Series provides an easy access to all the manual controls needed for cutting. The liquid crystal display (LCD), functional, directional and selection buttons make navigating through the machine's manual controls easy to do.





LED Indicator Lights

Three indicator lights on the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS control panel are part of the system's safety interlock system.

- **Power** The power light will illuminate when the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS is powered on.
- **Door** The door light will illuminate when the front door is open or improperly closed.
- Laser The laser light will illuminate when the laser is active and in operation.

WARNING

- DO NOT attempt to remove or modify any component of the safety interlock system.
- If at any time, any of the access doors are open and the "laser" LED is illuminated, unplug the laser system IMMEDIATELY and contact GCC technical support for service instructions.
- DO NOT operate the laser system if any component of the safety system is malfunctioning.

Directional and Selection Buttons

Function (F1 / F2 / F3 / F4) – Four function buttons allow you to select various functions which will change depending on what section of the menu you are in. Each function button's corresponding task will be displayed right above its respective button on the LCD display screen. Please note that in certain menus, not every function button will always be mapped to a corresponding action. In these situations, that particular button will not have a function.

Directional (\land / \lor / \triangleleft / \triangleright) – Four directional buttons allow you to navigate the selection cursor through the control panel menu and adjust the value of specific settings. In general, the \triangleleft / \triangleright directional buttons cycle through the various selections, while the \triangle / \triangledown directional buttons adjust the value of that particular selection.

Enter – Confirm the current selection.



Start / Stop – Allow you to start or stop cutting jobs, once those jobs have been successfully loaded onto the system.

Delete – Provide quick access to delete the current job.

Pause – Pause the current cutting process. Press again to resume the current process.


Scale – Tune the laser machine output scale to fit the original graphic file design scale to optimize the cutting precision.

Auto Feed – Feed the media to avoid paper jam and ensure smooth cutting operation. The feeding length is 35 cm each time when you press Auto Feed button.

Red Beam – Allow you to turn on or off the cross laser pointer on the lens carriage.



5.1.2 Graphic Control Panel Navigation Chart



The Accel. (Acceleration) function modifies the acceleration and deceleration of the X and Y rails to adjust and balance vector mode's quality and speed settings based on your specific job. <Speedy> mode offers the highest output speed while sacrificing certain degree of quality. Whereas <Quality> mode offers the highest quality, sacrificing output speed. Keep in mind that speed and quality are usually a trade-off.

Select Smoothing function to <YES>, the laser machine will smooth out the curve path, result in smooth edge, higher speed, while less precise in scale factor, whereas setting Smoothing to <NO>, the curve will move in more precision scale, less smooth path, and slower speed.

Menu Bar





Menu Bar

Tool Box

The default Tool Box is composed of the Standard Bar, the Properties Bar, the Draw Bar, the Font Bar, and the Edit Bar. These bars provide visual references for the most commonly used tools. More information regarding different tools would be present in the VIEW MENU section.

Work Area

The Work Area is where graphics placed to create a file. The area can be enlarged or decreased to equal the size of the materials that are to be engraved or cutting.

Property Table

All objects created or imported on the Work Area have their own unique sets of properties. These properties define how each specific object of groups of objects are displayed on the Work Area or marked by SmartCONTROLTM. To display the properties of an object or a group, simply highlight it and the specific property details should reveal themselves on the Property Table. If the Property Table is not currently active, choose




the object and press the right mouse button to choose Property Table.

NOTE

After you have edited one of the parameters in the Property Table, click on Apply or Apply to All in order to insert your changes.

Object Browser

The Object Browser would show a OBJECT BROWSER Window in the left side, and list all the objects you create on the working area, you can identify the object format, create sequence, name the object and select objects by clicking it in the OBJECT BROWSER Window. The objects shown in the upper level means its output sequence.

SmartCONTROL[™] provides 16 color pens, and each pen presents laser parameter setting, once colors are set, the pen would refer to the specified parameters when you apply the colors to an output. Pen Parameters under Processed Condition Setup would enable you to adjust the power, speed of each color pen.

- (1) Choose a color pen
- (2) Adjust the bar next to speed, power and PPI for the chosen color pen.

Remark:

1. Speed

The speed is calculated by percentage, which means some percentage of the max. speed of the indicated laser label cutter.

2. Power

The power is calculated by percentage, which means some percentage of the max laser power that the indicated laser label cutter has.

3. PPI

PPI (pulses-per-inch) represents the number of times the laser pulses (fires) per linear inch, exclusive for vector cutting. Higher PPI settings will generate deeper, overlapping laser pulses, resulting in cleaner cuts. Lower PPI settings (lower than 150) will result in the individual laser pulses being spread apart, resulting in a perforated effect (similar to



the perforation in the paper between mailing stamps).


4. Bridge

Checking the Bridge Cutting checkbox will allow users to easily create perforation lines (dash-line). Once see the line color along with another corresponding pen can be used in tandem to indicate the length of the gap and the uncut part of a perforation line. (If Pen 1 is selected for bridge cutting, Pen 9 will be reserved to the length of the connected lines of the perforation. If Pen 2 is selected, Pen 10 will be reserved and so on...)

5. Air

This checkbox controls the SmartAIR air-assist function. By selecting a pen color and checking this box will enable the SmartAIR air-assist function for that particular pen color. As an example, if you are performing label cutting, you may want to enable the SmartAIR air-assist to avoid the edges of prints turning yellow. To do this, you would simply need to select the pen color that you have assigned to the sections to be cut and select the Air checkbox for those particular pen colors.

Output Mode



(1) Mode

You can select from four primary mode settings, depending on your application or results you would like to achieve.



• Black & White mode

Select this mode when using clipart images or drawings with several colors, shades of gray, or many outlines. This mode outputs in a method similar to that of a black and white laser printer.

The GCC laser machine will interpret colored and shaded areas as 256-level shades of gray by producing a halftone effect while engraving. Instead of engraving only solid lines, gray or halftone areas will be a collection of dots with varying density.

The entire selected image will be engraved using a single set of power and speed settings (the black pen from the PEN menu. Please refer to the next section of the details regarding the PEN functions). The resolution and depth of these halftone areas can be adjusted with the DPI setting found on the Options page. Please note that selecting the Black & White mode will add a new Raster page to the menu. The Black & White mode dithering settings can be changed from the Raster page. (Please refer to the Raster section below for details). Experiment with different dithering settings to attain the desired results.

TIP

The Black & White mode interprets the processed image by the varying colors and shades. For the best results, we suggest you convert the image to a grayscale image with your graphics software prior to engraving in the Black & White mode.

· Manual color fill

Select this mode when you would like to designate specific power and speed settings and link them to certain colors of your image.

(2) Position

These selections allow you to control the positioning of the laser head after each job completion and before the next subsequent job.

• Home

will start a job from this home position and return to the home position after completed jobs.

Keeping your LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS Series clean and well maintained will ensure quality output, consistent reliability and extended product life. Smoke, dust or residue build-up inside the laser system or the mechanical components can cause a reduction in the laser power, irregularities in the motion system, reduced product life cycle, and a host of other avoidable problems. This section will cover how to perform regular maintenance on the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS work area, motion system, mirrors, and focal lens.

The frequency of the cleaning schedule will depend on number of variables such as the types of material you work with, the immediate work environment, the frequency of use, the quality of the exhaust system, etc.

- Electrical shock may occur if you do not turn off and unplug the Spirit Series before cleaning.
- Damage may occur to the system if you do not turn off and unplug the Spirit Series before cleaning.
- Always turn off and unplug the Spirit Series before cleaning!

6.2 Maintaining the Work area and Motion System

6.2.1 Cleaning the Work Area and Motion System

Clean the working area and the motion system on a frequent basis through the following steps:


- 1) Turn the power off and unplug the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS before cleaning.
- 2) Use a vacuum cleaner with a flexible nozzle to remove dust and debris from the work area and motion system.
- 3) Apply small amounts of all-purpose cleaner, alcohol, or acetone to a paper or cotton towel to clean the working area.
- 4) Apply a soap solution, all-purpose cleaner, or alcohol to a paper or cotton towel to wipe down the rails of the motion system.
- 5) Wait for all cleaning residue to dry completely before plugging in and operating the LABELEXPRESS/DECALEXPRESS.



- **4** Never pour or spray alcohol or acetone directly to the work table.
- 4 Oil, alcohol and acetone can cause fires or smoke build-up if improperly used.

6.2.2 Cleaning the Grid Drum

- 1. Turn off the machine, and move the tool carriage away from the area needed to be cleaned.
- 2. Raise the pinch rollers and move them away from the grid drum for cleaning.
- Use a bristle brush (a toothbrush is acceptable) to remove dust from the drum surface. Rotate the drum manually while cleaning.



6.2.3 Cleaning the Pinch Rollers

- 1. If the pinch rollers require a thorough cleaning, use a lint-free cloth or cotton swab to wipe away the accumulated dust from the rubber portion of the pinch rollers. To prevent the pinch rollers from rotating while cleaning, use your finger to hold the pinch rollers to prevent them from rotation.
- 2. To remove the deeply-embedded or persistent dust, use the lint-free cloth or cotton swab moistened with rubbing alcohol.


Note:

The daily maintenance of your cutting plotter is very important. Be sure to clean up the grid drum and pinch rollers regularly for better cutting accuracy and output quality.



6.2.4 Cleaning the Clamps and Waste Separation Bar

Sticky residues and dust may be generated during operation and left on the clamps on the work area or the waste separation bar on the back side. Use a lint-free cloth or cotton swab to wipe away the accumulated residues and dust. Be sure to remove the residues and dusts periodically for better output quality.





6.3 Cleaning the Optics System

6.3.1Removing the Mirrors


We recommend that you check the mirrors once or twice a week to see if they require cleaning.


- Mirrors should be removed for cleaning one at a time to avoid beam misalignment after placing them back to the lens holders.
- Refer to section 6.3.2 on how to clean the mirrors.

1. To clean the lens, remove the tray and loose the screws & tube.



6.3.2 Cleaning the Mirrors

After removing the mirror, you will want to inspect each mirror for scratches, smoke residue, or debris. If any residue or debris is present, use the following steps to clean the mirrors.

- Hold the mirror with the reflective side up, without touching the reflective side of the mirror (DO NOT apply any finger pressure or any other cleaning solutions to the mirror surface).
- 2) Drape a new sheet of lens tissue over the mirror.
- 3) Apply a few drops of lens cleaner on the tissue covered mirror (apply enough so that the tissue absorbs just enough solution to cover the mirror surface).
- 4) Pull the tissue across the mirror in only one direction.
- 5) Repeat the cleaning processes if the mirror is not completely clean after the first attempt.
- 6) Make sure that the mirror is completely dry before reinstalling it.





If the center of the mirror is scratched, contact the dealer in your location for a replacement.



6.3.3 Cleaning the Lens

Clean the lens inside the nozzle holder with lens cleanser, and apply cotton swab or lens tissue to dry off the remaining solution gently.
